

School Data Analysis


St. Patrick reviews a wide range of data throughout the year. The most important data are the classroom assessments, aligned to our curriculum standards, that our faculty develops, implements, and monitors week to week. We also use a variety of benchmark assessments and review students' growth and proficiency using MAP Growth Assessments. Diverse data, including academic and non-academic behavior, supports understanding the whole child and supporting their adolescent development.

The data below includes a snapshot of our students projected proficiency on the Kentucky Summative Assessment. While Catholic school students do not take this end-of-year assessment like public school students, NWEA MAP Growth provides this useful linking tool for analysis. We continue to celebrate our strengths and areas for growth. As you can see from the data, we are working to help more students move towards proficiency and distinguished in Math compared to Reading and Language.

2023-24 Math Proficiency




2023-24 Reading Proficiency

2023-24 Language Proficiency




Class of 2024 High School Placement Test

The chart below is a comparison of national percentiles of the categories tested on the High School Placement Test between all 8th grade students in the Archdiocese of Louisville group (blue) and St. Patrick 8th grade students (green).

St. Patrick students performed very well compared to their peers, particularly in Reading. According to the longitudinal data we have, it appears this is the highest Reading median score St. Patrick has ever achieved on the HSPT.

We expect there may be a few scholarships awarded this year, and we look forward to celebrating these and many other accomplishments for the Class of 2024 in May.




