Principal Report – Dr. Sturtzel

- Introduced Ms. Block, the new Librarian. She spoke on some of the current library needs.
- New age library combines library and STEM. Providing real work engagement in collaboration with class learning. Focus on building a culture of reading and authentic learning.
- Programs needs: more technology, newer books. The older books don't get the kids as excited and the love for reading isn't what it was pre pandemic. Ideas/Focus areas: books, technology: robotics, STEM tools, building materials.
- School is off to a strong start. School initiative is to be proactive about communication this year with parents. Trying to get as much information as possible out.
- Regular programming up and running in September. First grandparent day in a few years. Over 350, great turnout and very successful.
- Introduction of 7th and 8th grade buddies.
- Getting back in to the routine of school, raising hands, voice levels, etc.
- 8th boys and girls confirmation retreats, they have high school graduates of St. Pats leading both retreats.
- Extra circulars are coming back.
