







## 7th Grade Summer Reading

This summer you will be required to select one nonfiction book of your choice that is at least 150 pages. This might be a biography or autobiography of your favorite artist or athlete, a historical retelling of a major event, etc. The purpose of incorporating choice is to create an opportunity for you to find a text that is on your individual reading level and related to topics you enjoy. With that in mind, you should choose a nonfiction book you have not yet read about a topic in which you are genuinely interested

You will need to take at least one full page of typed notes over your nonfiction book. These notes should include page numbers.

• **Non-Fiction Book Notes Requirements:** At least one full page, single spaced, size 12, Times New Roman font. May be written in bullet point form or complete sentences. Must include page numbers.

Upon your return to school, you will be creating a "book talk" presentation to share your chosen nonfiction book with your classmates. Details and specific instructions will be given in the first few weeks of school. The notes prepared over the summer will be essential in guiding and informing your presentation.

- career choices
- accomplishments or failures
